PLAYDOUGH

Ingredients:	
1/2 cup of salt	1 cup flour
1 cup of water	1 tablespoon oil
2 tablespoons of cream of tartar	Food Coloring (Desired color
Directions:	

- 1. Mix the flour, salt, cream of tartar and oil in a pan.
- 2. Mix the water with the food coloring.
- 3. Add the water/color-mix to the other ingredients, stir well.
- 4. Cook on medium heat for 4–5 minutes, while constantly stirring.
- 5. When the mixture becomes "doughy", remove from heat and start kneading. (the dough will be hot, so mind your hands)

When desired texture is achieved, the playdough is finished, enjoy!

LIQUID STARCH SLIME RECIPE

***Make sure to wash hands thoroughly after playing with slime.

YOU WILL NEED:

1/2 Cup of Washable PVA Clear Glue or White Glue

1/4-1/2 Cup of Liquid Starch

1/2 Cup of Water

Food coloring, confetti, glitter, and other fun mix-ins

Directions:

- 1. In a bowl add 1/2 cup water and 1/2 cup glue and mix well to combine completely.
- 2. Now's the time to add color, glitter, or confetti!
 - Remember when you add color to white glue, the color will be lighter. Use clear glue for jewel-toned colors!
- 3. Pour in 1/4 cup of liquid starch and stir well.
 - You will see the slime immediately start to form and pull away from the sides of the bowl. Keep stirring until you have a gooey blob of slime. The liquid should be gone!
- 4. Start kneading your slime! It will appear stringy at first but just work it around with your hands and you will notice the consistency change.
 - SLIME MAKING TIP: The trick with liquid starch slime is to put a few drops of the liquid starch onto your hands before picking up the slime. However, keep in mind that although adding more liquid starch reduces the stickiness, and it will eventually create a stiffer slime.

CHALK

What You Will Need:

1 cup pottery plaster

3/4 cup water

tempura paint in various colors

a silicone mold

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. In a large bowl, combine the plaster, and water and mix them well. Once those two ingredients are combined, you're ready to add your paint.
- 2. Add about a tablespoon at a time (no need to measure, just squirt in a little at a time) and mix well, until you've reached the desired color.

***Just keep in mind that the more paint you add, the longer it will take your chalk to set. I learned this lesson the hard way!

3. Once your chalk is dry, you can simply turn your mold upside down, tap the bottom of the mold, and the chalk should just fall out! It is ready to be used!
